BeeTalk

The Basic Assessment is a very friendly assessment of beekeeping husbandry conducted "over the hive" by an assessor from outside the branch. It is intended for beekeepers who have at least a year's experience and the achievement of the Basic Certificate is a requirement for going on to take further exams and assessments run by BBKA. There was a 97% pass rate in 2017.

Here at WLBK, we will be running three "revision" sessions on **19th March**, **26th March** and **9th April**, to address the syllabus, focussing on the parts people identify as their needs. This gives candidates a chance to chat, get geared up for the season and feel confident. We will not be outside, because the sessions are at BBKA, Stoneleigh in the evening, but we will practice good handling etc indoors. We also offer to do a "practice" basic assessment for each person in the group, if they want to do it.

We will arrange the actual assessment days later in the season, so that the assessors come to our branch apiary at convenient times.

The fee for the sessions is $\pounds 20$, which includes the basic assessment enrolment fee (the three sessions are free, in effect), and we will fill in the application forms at the first session. Don't worry about preparation- that's what the sessions are for!

Hints and Tips

- If you go to feed your bees and find a colony on the point of starvation with bees immobile you can spray them with warm syrup. Once they have recovered then more permanent feeding will be needed to get them through to when they can once more support themselves.
- Fresh onion applied to a bee sting is soothing and healing. Scrape out the sting then apply onion juice or rub the freshly cut surface of the onion onto the stung area (Thanks to the Montgomeryshire BKA for this little gem)
- The swarm season will be upon us soon so why not finish off that skep you started last year? Make a good job of it and then it will be ready to enter into the Honey Show.... it's not until September 13th so plenty of time!
